



Nationality / Citizenship

You must be either:

- · Citizens of India,
- · Subjects of Nepal or Bhutan,
- Tibetan Refugees who arrived in India before 1st January 1962 with the intention of permanent settlement,
- A person of Indian origin who migrated from specified countries with the intention of permanent settlement in India.

Age Limit

You should be between 20 years and 28 years old as of 01.07.2024. This means you should have been born not earlier than 02.07.1996 and not later than 01.07.2004.

Educational Qualification

You must have a Graduation degree in any discipline from a recognized University or an equivalent qualification recognized by the Central Government. When registering, you need to provide proof of passing the qualifying examination through a valid mark sheet or Degree Certificate. Proficiency in computer operations is mandatory, which you can demonstrate with a Certificate, Diploma, or Degree, or by having studied Computer/Information Technology as a subject in High School, College, or Institute. Additionally, proficiency in the Official Language of the State/UT where you apply is preferred, including reading, writing, and speaking skills.

Meeting these eligibility criteria ensures that you can apply for the IBPS Clerk Exam 2024 and pursue a career in the banking sector.


There are two levels in the selection process for the IBPS Clerk exam 2024. One is the IBPS Clerk Prelims and the other is its Mains examination.

Preliminary Examination

The IBPS Clerk Preliminary Exam consists of three sections: English Language, Numerical Ability, and Reasoning Ability

- 1. English Language: 30 questions, 30 marks, 20 minutes duration.
- 2. Numerical Ability: 35 questions, 35 marks, 20 minutes duration.
- 3. Reasoning Ability: 35 questions, 35 marks, 20 minutes duration.
 - Total Marks: The exam is out of 100 marks in total.
 - Passing Marks: Candidates need to clear the cutoff set by IBPS for each section to qualify for the Mains Exam.
 - Penalty: There is a penalty for wrong answers, deducting one-fourth of the marks assigned to that question.

Mains Examination

The IBPS Clerk Mains Exam includes four sections: Reasoning Ability & Computer Aptitude, English Language, Quantitative Aptitude, and General/Financial Awareness.

- 1. Reasoning Ability & Computer Aptitude: 50 questions, 60 marks, 45 minutes duration.
- 2. English Language: 40 questions, 40 marks, 35 minutes duration.
- 3. Quantitative Aptitude: 50 questions, 50 marks, 45 minutes duration.
- 4. General/Financial Awareness: 50 questions, 50 marks, 35 minutes duration.







- Total Marks: The Mains Exam totals 200 marks.
- Time Limit: Candidates have 160 minutes (2 hours 40 minutes) to complete all sections.
- Language Options: The exam is conducted in 13 regional languages along with English and Hindi.
- Penalty: Similar to Prelims, there is a penalty for wrong answers.

Final Selection

Marks obtained in the Preliminary Exam are not counted towards final selection and candidates must qualify for the main exam to be eligible for final merit. The final merit list is prepared based on the aggregate score out of 100 in the Mains Exam for each category. Candidates with the highest merit rank in each category are selected for clerical cadre positions in public sector banks.

IBPS Clerk Exam Date 2024 - Syllabus

- English Language
- Numerical Ability
- · Reasoning Ability

The main examination consists of four sections:

- · General/Financial Awareness
- General English
- · Reasoning Ability & Computer Aptitude
- · Quantitative Aptitude
