

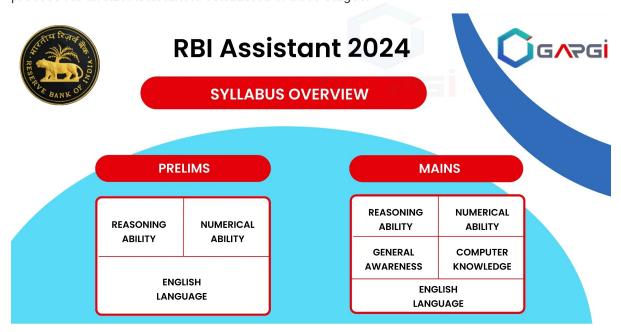

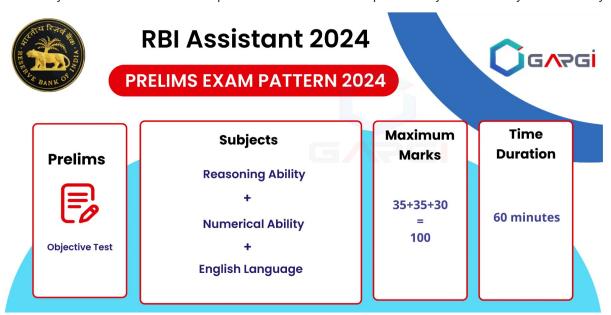

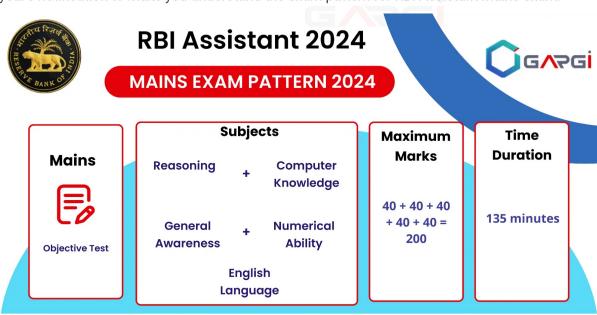

To be eligible for the RBI Assistant position, you must be an Indian citizen with a strong academic foundation. This means you'll need to be between 20 and 28 years old on the specified date and hold a bachelor's degree from a recognized university with a minimum of 50% marks.

RBI Assistant Age Limit

To be eligible for the RBI Assistant recruitment, candidates must adhere to the prescribed age limit. Applicants must have attained the age of 20 years but not exceeded 28 years as of the specified cut-off date.

RBI Assistant Age Relaxation

The age relaxations allowed for reserved category RBI Assistant is mentioned in the snippet below:

Sr. No	Category	Relaxation in Age
(i)	Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe (SC / ST)	By 5 years, i.e., up to 33 years
(ii)	Other Backward Classes (OBC)	By 3 years, i.e., up to 31 years
(iii)	Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)	By 10 years (GEN/EWS), 13 years (OBC) & 15 years (SC/ST)

(iv	·)	Ex-Servicemen	To the extent of service rendered by them in Armed Forces plus an additional period of 3 years subject to maximum of 50 years.
(v))	Widows/divorced women/ women judicially separated who are not re-married	Upto 35 years (40 years for SC/ST)
(vi	i)	Candidates having work experience in Reserve Bank of India	To the extent of number of years of such experience, subject to maximum of 3 years.

RBI Assistant Educational Qualifications

To be eligible for the RBI Assistant post, you generally need a bachelor's degree with at least 50% marks. Also, knowing the regional language of your state is often required.

RBI Assistant Nationality

A candidate must be either:

- i. a citizen of India, or
- ii. a subject of Nepal, or
- iii. a subject of Bhutan, or
- iv. a Tibetan refugee who came over to India before 1st January 1962 with the intention of permanently settling in India, or
- v. a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Malawi, Zaire, Ethiopia and Vietnam with the intention of permanently settling in India.
