



IBPS Clerk Exam Pattern 2024 - Preliminary Exam

The preliminary exam has three sections with a total of 100 marks. The test is an objective-based online paper where one hour is allocated to the candidates. Those who qualify for this part, securing the cut-off prescribed by IBPS, are eligible to appear for the mains exam. The three sections of the preliminary examination include English Language, Numerical Ability, and Reasoning Ability. Below is a snippet from the previous year's notification for a better understanding of the IBPS Clerk exam pattern 2024:

- The total number of questions asked in the IBPS Clerk Exam is 100.
- The maximum mark allotted for the preliminary examination is 100.
- The mark allotted for every correct answer is 1 mark.
- A negative marking of 1/4 of the allotted mark will be deducted for every wrong answer.
- The duration of the preliminary examination is 60 minutes.

IBPS Clerk Exam Pattern 2024 - Mains Exam

According to the official IBPS Clerk Notification 2024, the IBPS Clerk mains exam will have a total of 190 questions. Aspirants will be given a total of 160 minutes to finish the objective-based online test. Before last year, the IBPS Clerk exam pattern 2024 was such that the Computer Aptitude and Reasoning Ability sections were allotted separately. However, as per the new rule, both of these sections have been merged since last year. The details of the IBPS Clerk exam pattern 2024 for mains exam are presented in the snippet below:



To be eligible for the IBPS Clerk Exam, you must fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria detailed by IBPS. It's essential to produce the necessary documents during the application process. Make sure to review these details and ensure you meet all the requirements. Any exception can lead to the rejection of your application.

Nationality

To be eligible, you must be:

- · an Indian citizen,
- · a subject of Nepal or Bhutan,
- · a Tibetan refugee who settled in India before January 1, 1962, or
- a person of Indian origin who migrated from specific countries (Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Zambia, Malawi, Zaire, Ethiopia, or Vietnam) with the intention of permanently settling in India.

Educational Qualifications

- Have a Graduation degree from a recognized University or an equivalent qualification recognized by the Central Government.
- Possess a valid mark sheet or Degree Certificate on the day of registration and indicate your graduation marks percentage online.
- Be computer literate, with a Certificate/Diploma/Degree in computer operations/language or have studied Computer/Information Technology in school or college.
- Preferably, be proficient in the official language of the State/UT for which you are applying (able to read, write, and speak the language).

Age Limit

You must be between 20 and 28 years old, born between 02.07.1996 and 01.07.2004.
