IBPS PO Mains Exam Pattern

To qualify for the interview round, candidates must clear both the Preliminary and Main exams. The final merit list is based on scores from the Main exam and interview, with an 80:20 ratio.

IBPS PO Mains Exam Pattern – Paper 1

For the IBPS PO Mains Exam Pattern, candidates must appear for various sections including Reasoning, Economy, English Language, Data Interpretation, and Essay & Letter Writing. The Reasoning section is allotted 60 marks, the Economy section 40 marks, the English Language section 40 marks, and Data Interpretation 60 marks. Additionally, the Essay and Letter Writing in English carry 25 marks. In total, the examination is scored out of 225 marks. The total duration of the exam is 210 minutes, comprising 180 minutes for the main sections and an additional 30 minutes for the Essay and Letter Writing. Candidates must pass the Mains to be eligible for the Interview round.

Major Changes:

- **Section Division:** The Reasoning, English Language, and Data Analysis & Interpretation sections will be divided into two parts: Section A and Section B.
- **Compulsory Questions:** All questions in both sections, A and B, are compulsory to attempt.
- **Variable Marks:** Some questions will carry 1 mark, while others will carry 2 marks.
- **Negative Marking:** 0.25 marks will be deducted for each incorrect answer.

IBPS PO Mains Exam Syllabus

The main exam is a crucial phase of the IBPS PO Mains Exam Pattern. The candidate's score in the IBPS PO Mains Exam Pattern holds significant weight in the final selection for the position of Probationary Officer. The Mains Examination comprises 4 + 1 sections: Reasoning & Computer Aptitude, English Language, Quantitative Aptitude, and General Awareness. Additionally, IBPS has introduced a descriptive paper in the Mains Exam for selecting candidates for the post of Probationary Officer.

The IBPS PO Mains exam is composed of two parts: an Objective Test and a Descriptive Test. The Objective Test is computer-based and consists of multiple-choice questions, while the Descriptive Test evaluates writing skills through an essay and letter writing. For the Objective Test, most sections adhere to a marking scheme of one mark for correct answers and a deduction of 0.25 marks for incorrect ones. However, the English Language section is unique, as it awards one mark for correct responses without imposing any negative marking. In contrast, the Descriptive Test, which contributes 25 marks to the total, does not involve negative marking and assesses candidates based on the content, structure, grammar, and language employed in their writing.

IBPS PO Mains Exam Normalisation

Normalization is a statistical process employed to adjust for potential discrepancies in question paper difficulty across different exam shifts. Since the IBPS PO Mains exam is conducted in multiple shifts, the level of difficulty can vary between these sessions. To ensure fairness in evaluating candidates, normalization is implemented. This process recalculates scores to balance the difficulty levels, allowing for a more equitable comparison of performance across different shifts. The normalized scores are then used to determine the final merit list and cutoff marks for the exam.

The score obtained by candidates in the mains exam is normalized across shifts using the Equipercentile method. The normalized scores above 40% (35% for SC/ST and PWD) are then used in subsequent stages. The scores above the IBPS cutoff are used to draw up a list of candidates who are then interviewed.

IBPS PO Exam Dates 2024

The IBPS PO recruitment process typically spans several months. While the exact dates for 2024 haven't been finalized, we can anticipate the following general timeline based on previous years: the notification is usually released between July and August, followed by the preliminary exam in September or October. The mains exam is generally conducted in November or December, with the interview round taking place in January or February of the subsequent year. It's crucial to remember that these are approximate dates, and the actual schedule may vary. For precise and official information, always refer to the notification released by
