Analytical Reasoning Questions

Directions: In each question below, a statement followed by two courses of action numbered I and II, on the basis of the information given in the statement you have to assume everything in the statement to be true, then decide which of the suggested courses of action logically follow for pursuing.

Question

Statement: A survey was held in a few jails and according to the result of that survey the Jail X inmates are extremely dangerous individuals. The survey result was extremely different from the thought of the organization. Course of Action: (i) Increasing the number of security guards stationed at the jail should be applied. (ii) It is necessary to transfer some prisoners to another jail.

Difficulty : Moderate

Average Time : 58 Seconds

Options :

1. Only I follows
2. Only II follows
3. Both follow
4. Neither I nor II follows
5. Either I nor II follows

Solution

The correct answer is **Option 1** i.e. **Only I follows**

Courses of Action:

(i) Increasing the number of security guards stationed at the jail should be applied.

(ii) It is necessary to transfer some prisoners to another jail.

Explanation: Only the first course of action is appropriate since, according to a statement, the prisoners are extremely dangerous individuals. As a result, it is preferable to send out extra guards to guard against potential mishaps. Shifting is not a problem-solving strategy.

Hence, the correct answer is **Only I follows.**
