Question

In this question, the statement is followed by two conclusions. Which of the two conclusion(s) is/are true? Statement: $Z > F$
 $A = B = G > S$ E Conclusions: I. $Z > A$ II. $G > F$

Difficulty : Moderate

Average Time : 35 Seconds

Options :

1. Only conclusion I is true.
2. Only conclusion II is true.
3. Both conclusions I and II are true.
4. Neither conclusion I nor II is true.

Solution

The correct answer is **Option 4** i.e. **Neither conclusion I nor II is true.**

Statement: $Z > F$ $A = B = G > S$ E

Conclusions:

I. $Z > A$: **False** ($Z > F$ A implies $Z > A$ and not $Z > A$.)

II. $G > F$: **False** ($G = B = A$ $F > Z$ implies $G > F$ and not $G > F$.)

Hence, the correct answer is **Neither conclusion I nor II is true.**
