2. "His **pessimistic** outlook often led him to expect the worst."
 - "Pessimistic" is the opposite of "optimistic."
3. "The **gloomy** weather matched his downcast mood."
 - "Gloomy" and "downcast" suggest a negative outlook, which is opposite to "optimistic."

"She was always **cheerful** and full of positivity."

- "Cheerful" and "positivity" are similar to "optimistic."

5. "Though what she was **promising** to look out for, she had no idea."

- "Promising" means showing possibility of achievement or excellence, which is similar to "optimistic."

The sentences with words opposite in meaning to "optimistic" are 2 and 3.

So, the correct answer is **Only 2 & 3**.
