

Word Swap Questions Overview

Word Swap Questions have a good weightage in the Banking Exam and the type of question asked in Banking exam is similar to the question mentioned below. It has been solved and explained by Gargi.ai Experts and they have tried to elaborate the concept used in Word Swap Questions.

Question

In the following sentence, five words are given in bold. They may or may not be in the correct position in the sentence. You have to find out which two or more words should exchange their position so that the sentence becomes grammatically correct and meaningful. If no words need to exchange their position, then mark the option 'No error'. The school was a) focused on teaching the students the tough b) realities of life and equipping them to face hardship with greater confidence. The students, on the other hand, were not even c) premises and were creating a d) sincere on the school e) ruckus.

Difficulty : Moderate

Average Time : 53 Seconds

Options :

1. a-b
2. c-d-e
3. a-b, d-e
4. b-c, c-e
5. No error

Solution

The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **c-d-e**.

First, let's see the definition of each emboldened term :

- **Focused:** The centre of interest or activity;
- **Realities:** The state of things as they actually exist, as opposed to an idealistic or notional idea of them;
- **Premises:** House or building, occupied by a business or considered in an official context;
- **Sincere:** Free from pretence or deceit; and
- **Ruckus:** A commotion.

To make the sentence contextually correct, we need to interchange c) with d), d) with e), and e) with c).

The word **sincere** best fits at c), the word **ruckus** fits best at d), and the word **premises** fits best at e), because contextually the sentence is talking about how much the school is trying to provide the students and how little effort the students are putting in.

Therefore, to make this sentence grammatically correct, we have to change the word sequence as given below:

The school was **focused** on teaching the students the tough **realities** of life and equipping them to face hardship with greater confidence. The students, on the other hand, were not even **sincere** and were creating a **ruckus** on the school **premises**.
