

Word Swap Questions Overview

Word Swap Questions have a good weightage in the Banking Exam and the type of question asked in Banking exam is similar to the question mentioned below. It has been solved and explained by Gargi.ai Experts and they have tried to elaborate the concept used in Word Swap Questions.

Question

In the following sentences five words are given in bold. They may or may not be in the correct position in the sentence. You have to find out which two or more words should exchange their position so that sentence become gramatically correct and meaningful. If no words need to exchange their position, then mark the option 'No error'. The (A) irritating weather was (B) sultry the people in the city. No one wanted to go out of their homes in such (C) relaxing. Everyone felt like (D) weather in their homes with the air conditioner functioning at the lowest possible (E) temperature.

Difficulty : Moderate

Average Time : 52 Seconds

Options :

1. A-B, C-E
2. C-D, A-E
3. A-C, B-D
4. A-B, C-D
5. No error

Solution

The correct answer is **Option 4** i.e. **A-B, C-D**.

- The given statement is incorrect since it does not make any sense if we go with it. Therefore, option 5 can be ruled out easily.
- To make the sentence contextually correct, we need to interchange **A-B and C-D**.
- The word '**Sultry**' means '*(of the air or weather) hot and humid*'.
- After going through the meaning, we can easily identify that the word '**sultry**' best fits at **A**, the word **irritating** best fits at **B**, the word **weather** best fits at **C** and the word **relax** fits best at **D**.

So, the correct sentene is: **The sultry weather was irritating the people in the city. No one wanted to go out of their homes in such weather. Everyone felt like relaxing in their homes with the air conditioner functioning at the**

lowest possible temperature.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 4** i.e. **A-B, C-D**.
